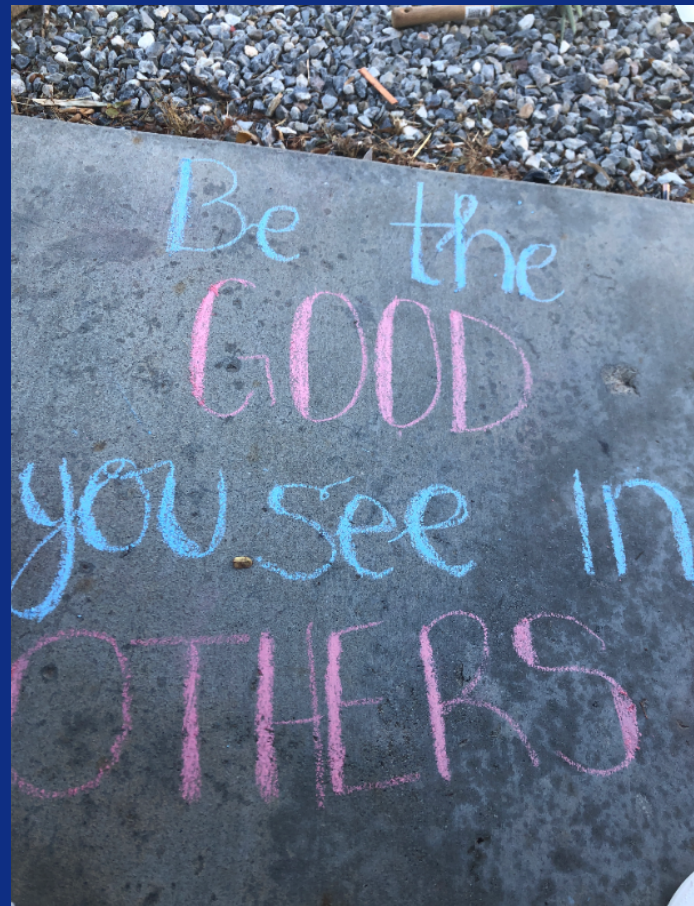

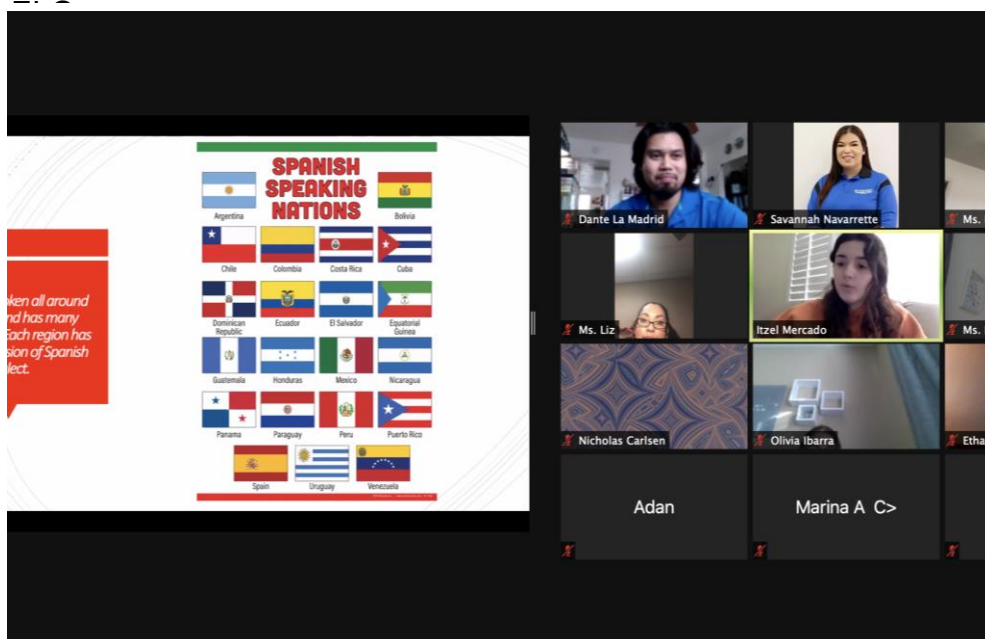
A Toast to the masters...

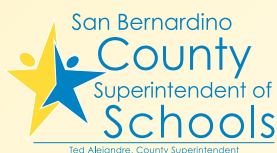

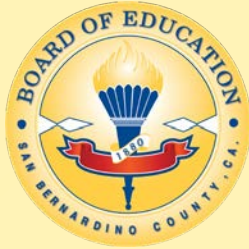

Welcome to the 2020-21 San Bernardino County Mock Trial, People v. Croddy, Virtual Awards Ceremony!

The Mock Trial Program was created to help students acquire a working knowledge of our judicial system, develop analytical abilities, communication skills, and gain an understanding of their obligations and responsibilities as participating members of our society.

Student teams studied a hypothetical case, conducted legal research, and received guidance from volunteer attorneys in courtroom procedures, trial preparation and presented their case before volunteer scoring attorneys and judges. The trial itself is a simulation of a criminal case, in which students portray lawyers, witnesses, court clerks, and bailiffs.

This year more than 400 San Bernardino County students, in grades 9-12, actively experienced the excitement of working in teams, exchanging ideas, setting goals, and examining issues while interacting with positive role models from their communities.

Our winning county team will participate in the State Mock Trial in Los Angeles, March 18-21, 2021 (if in-person competition or virtual), to compete with their peers from across California. If at the state competition, our County team qualifies, they will go on to compete in the Mock Trial National Competition in Evansville, Indiana, May 13-15, 2021 (if in-person competition or virtual).

Students and coaches, we are so proud of your hard work and dedication during this unprecedented time. Congratulations to each participant!
